

READ ISAIAH 9:6

DAY 1

It's Christmas! There are so many things that bring joy this time of year. Snowflakes, presents, lights, even crazy Christmas sweaters. But even the most wonderful time of the year isn't always joyful. That's why we've defined joy as finding a way to be happy even when things don't go your way.

God sent Isaiah as a prophet with a special message, that God would one day send His Son, Jesus! And though God made this promise long before it came true, we celebrate that special birth today. Can you imagine what it must have been like for Mary? One day, she was going about her business when an angel suddenly appeared right in front of her! And this angel named Gabriel had a message that kind of went like this:

Gabriel: "Hey Mary, you will have a baby. And He will be the Son of God."

Mary: "I'm sorry, what?"

Gabriel: "Don't worry, what God says will always come true."

READ 2 (ORINTHIANS 1:20 DAY 4

Today's verse tells us that when God makes a promise, it's always "yes!" God will do what He says He will do. Always. We know this is true because of Jesus. God promised to send a Savior to us and He did.

Did you catch the second part of the verse? "Amen" means, I agree! Joy comes when we recognize how good God is and how He never changes. Next to the promises God gives us, write the word "Amen" to show that you agree that the promise is true!
