- 2. Take some time to reflect on and capture moments from the last few weeks. Make a list of what surprised, encouraged and stretched you. Continue adding to this list during this season to help you keep an eternal perspective.
- 3. Find a way to worship through your grieving process: dance, sing, paint, write, walk, praise!
