

Week 4 • Sept 11 Disciple Maker

Introduction

In our last week of the series *Moved*, Pastor Jesse talks about the last step of the discipleship path at Prairie Lakes Church: Being a Disciple-Maker. He shares what it looks like to get stuck when you are further along in your journey with Jesus and get confused by the warning signs, such as not "feeling" like serving or lacking spiritual "fruit" in your life. He explains that those who truly understand Jesus' message will follow Jesus' ways, no matter the circumstances.

Discussion

- 1. When you think of a disciple-maker, who comes to mind? What qualities do they possess that makes them a disciple-maker?
- 2. Read Acts 11:19-30. Who started discipling the Greek people in Antioch? How did Barnabas and Saul (Paul) join in the discipling?
- 3. List the qualities you see in someone who disciples others. What do they do? How do they act toward others? Does their life look fruitful? How?
- 4. What areas of your life do you feel "stuck"? How is it affecting your ability to be obedient to God's calling on your life? Pray for each other in your group.

Take Action

- 1. Pray about where you are right now on the discipleship path. If you feel stuck, pray about what next steps you need to take to get unstuck. If you aren't stuck, pray about how you can help others on the path behind you.
- 2. The more we understand Jesus, the more we can follow him. Choose one of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John) and read a chapter a week; focus on the character of Jesus and his message.
- 3. Take a walk around your neighborhood, workplace, or park; ask God to give you a heart to reach others for Jesus.
